

Holy Trinity Parish Annual Meeting Minutes

Feb 1, 2026

The meeting formally called to order at 12:35 pm and opened with prayer by Fr. Jady.

Ben Strickland appointed as secretary.

Minutes

The parish reviewed the minutes from the 2025 annual meeting. Eric Macy motioned to receive the minutes, and Jeremiah Regan seconded. The minutes were received.

Rector's Report

Intro: Fr. Jady and his family are continuing to settle in during the 5 months since coming here. He is especially blessed that the church was in such good hands on his arrival that he could take up the mantle and continue.

House: As a family update, they bought the Hillsdale St. house but will probably sell it due to refurbishments needed and the quality of their rental. He does want to wait for the time being. For now it can be used by the church and the student body. There is a hope that a partnership with the Davenant Institute could secure it as "our version of the Grotto"

Davenant: Jady's appointment to president is in line with the mission of the church. There is a possibility to expand. Ideally we could staff and support a Protestant, Christian study center.

ACNA: There are some serious problems in the leadership, but it is founded on good formularies and remains orthodox, biblically-centered, and unafraid of tradition.

Bookkeeper's Report

Bookkeeper Green guided the parish through a review of the finances from 2025 and the budget for 2026.

Review of 2025:

The Operating Revenue or the money used for day-to-day needs of the parish was \$293,474.62 and we came out with a surplus of \$97,212.31, mainly because we didn't pay a rector for eight months. We also created a reimbursement form to make that process more streamlined.

Projected 2026 Budget:

There was a discussion about specific items and total pledges that were all answered by Timothy Green. There was also discussion about how the budget will be reflected in a potential building acquisition, etc. This year will be one of planning. If financial/budget action needs to be taken, it will be in the 2027 budget.

Jady: Jeremiah was tasked to lead the church while we didn't have a rector and he did well. We are sad to see him leave vestry (applause)

Jeremiah Regan: It was a blessing to go through the period because of how the members of the church stepped up (listed the names of all who preached).

Bill Hill: We have reserved Pakogon State Park from August 9-16 for a spiritual and recreational retreat. The cost is \$3000 plus additions like food, etc. There will be a committee to plan the activities.

Election of New Vestry Members

Senior Warden Regan reviewed nominations for vestry. The vestry increased the number to 7.

The vestry also nominated Timothy Green, Ben Strickland, and Russell Richardson. *David Danford Motion. Renee Young Second.*

There were oppositions raised from the floor about all of them being in the same demographic and the representative nature of the vestry itself. These three were selected because of the need for money management and a building project were the top priorities.

The measure passed, with a number of parishioners opposed.

Welcome the new vestry (followed by the oath).
