Regular Sacrifices

(Numbers 28 and 29)

<u>Daily</u> (twice daily, morning and evening) – year-old male lamb (burnt) with a grain and libation offering <u>Weekly</u> (on Sabbath) – 2 males lambs (both burnt) with their grain and libation offerings + daily offerings <u>Monthly</u> (on first) – 2 bulls, 1 ram, 7 male lambs (all burnt) with their grain and libation offerings, and 1 goat (sin) + daily offerings

Holy Day Sacrifices

Passover - 1 male lamb, killed, boiled, and eaten by family at home in one night, remainder burned, blood on lintels (for Passover proper)

+ 2 bulls, 1 ram, 7 lambs (all burnt) with their grain and libation offerings, and 1 goat (sin) + daily offerings (for following seven days)

Feast of Weeks – 2 bulls, 1 ram, 7 lambs (all burnt) with their grain and libation offerings, and 1 goat (sin) + daily offerings

Feast of Trumpets – 1 bull, 1 ram, 7 lambs (all burnt) with their grain and libation offerings, and 1 goat (sin)

Day of Atonement - 1 bull (sin) and 1 ram (burnt) for priest, 1 goat (sin) and 1 goat (scape) for people (for atonement ritual proper)

+ 1 bull, 1 ram, 7 lambs (all burnt) with their grain and libation offerings, and 1 goat (sin) + daily offerings

Feast of Booths/Pentecost – day one: 13 bulls, 2 rams, 14 lambs (all burnt) with their grain and libation offerings, and 1 goat (sin) + daily offerings; following seven days: one less bull each day but all rest the same
